Hilda House Community

A resident who lives at the 'Hilda House Community' in Spittal held an event in the SCC in March to celebrate 'International Women's Day' and was pleased to gather together 50 people for the event. The global theme was 'Accelerate action towards equality for women'. "What a lovely, heartwarming, emotionally charged and important morning it was!" wrote one participant, following a time of listening to women speaking to the countries they were representing. This included Ukraine, Uganda, USA and South Africa.

Fair Trade, local businesses, our gardening group, local crafts stall and other organisations were represented, alongside a Girl's Band led by Darcy Martin, the Salmon Queen, who, with her attendant Jessie O'Mara, opened the event, and other live global music. "All kept us on our toes and gave us much to think about", said the Revd Elizabeth Baxter, Chair of the 'Hilda House Community', which is in process of registering as a Charity. Hilda House are a pastoral and educational community, especially working towards combating patriarchal injustices for all, with a particular focus on women and girls. So, as well as enjoying a happy event they were challenged to continue their work.

Beach Wheelchairs


The container for the Beach Wheelchairs recently had a make over.

The booking line number is 0300 999 4444 and choose the option for Spittal/Berwick. You will be met by a volunteer at the site who will allow you access to the equipment.

The location is Spittal Park and Splash Park - W3W ///modern.twigs.value.

Disabled toilets are located close by at the rear of the Pavilion building and they have a key for these facilities.
